for THE MATURE CHRISTIAN:

In 1 John 4, the apostle explains that God is love. Who God is is the very definition of love.

In his book, <u>Listening to His</u> <u>Heartbeat</u>, Harold Shank presents that Exodus 34:5-7 is the more detailed breakdown of what it is for God to be love. Shank makes the case that this passage of scripture is the most quoted and alluded to in the Old Testament.

Borrowing from Shank's book: "The words from Ex. 34:5-7 were often used during a time of crisis because they brought comfort. Think of a present crisis and form a prayer using words from Exodus to address it. WEEKLY MEMORY VERSE: "...Do not disturb or awaken my love Until she pleases."

Song of Songs 8:4

for THE GROWING CHRISTIAN:

The author of The Song of Songs, under the inspiration of God, warns us not to awaken romantic love until we are ready to enter it by God's terms (i.e. with exclusivity, commitment, in purity).

It may be you feel that, in one way or another, you have lost that purity. Read through the following promises that you are a new creation in Christ. Seek to honor God, yourself, and your spouse (or possible future spouse) by walking in holiness each new day.
