PROTECTING ASSEMBLY

1 TIMOTHY 2

for Children:

Roll out some modeling clay
(or cookie dough) and cut out some
gingerbread men with a cookie cutter.
Then try shaping your own people with the
clay or dough. Which are more interesting,
fun, or special? Read Psalm 139:13-16.
There are times you may want to be like
someone else, but God knew exactly what
He was doing when He created you, and
God doesn't make mistakes. Trust what
God says in the Bible about who
He created you to be, and
hold onto that truth
as you grow.

for the Mature Christian:

Read 1 Timothy 2 (extra: Romans 13:1-7). Paul uses four words to describe the types of prayers involved in Sunday assembly. There are prayers for specific needs, appeals to God to act providentially in the lives of others (for blessing or correction), and prayers of thanksgiving for the blessings and good gifts God has given. What's more, these prayers are offered for all humanity,

for the **Growing** Christian:

Paul intended the letters he wrote to Timothy to be read aloud before the Christians in Ephesus. This meant that as Paul was encouraging Timothy, he would also be teaching the congregation how to live according to God's design.

Paul's First Letter to Timothy has much to teach Christians on how to keep the worship assembly on the first day of the week a time for praising God, remembering Christ's sacrifice, and to be encouraged by God's promises. Specifically in the second chapter Paul warns against division and distraction caused by arguments, pride, and vanity.

Read again Ephesians 4:1-16. Prayerfully consider the ways you can be proactive in preventing distraction and division in the Body of Christ. Is there a task you can take up to ease the burden of your brother or sister in Christ? Is there a disagreement that needs resolution and forgiveness? It can be a great encouragement to to others to volunteer a prayer, or attend a Bible study. What is the next step you think God is calling you to?
