for the **Growing** Christian:

Read Hosea 3:1-3. Hosea did not abandon Gomer when she sold herself into prostitution. Instead, as a loving and faithful husband, he pursued her, purchased her back, and asked for her recommitment. His ransom and faithfulness was then used by God as a sign to Israel of God's faithfulness to

those that would return and recommit to Him.

IEALOUSY

Each Sunday morning, we assemble to remember the ransom paid to redeem us from slavery to sin. Jesus did not pay with barley and silver, but with His body and blood. Read Matthew 26:26-28. Part of sharing in communion is a chance to recommit ourselves as Christ's Bride to an exclusive relationship with Him. It means prayerfully considering the cost of our redemption and how to respond to that grace with changed lives in the week ahead.

Read Hosea 2:14-23. Hosea prophesied a future where God would change the hearts of the Israelites, removing compromise with the surrounding culture. This was exemplified in the change from the Canaanite word, *Baali*, for husband, to the Hebrew word, *Ishi*.

After the return from exile,

200 years later, a new generation of repentant Israelites showed the change in their language. Old names were changed, e.g. Eshbaal (1 Ch. 8:33) to Ish-bosheth (2 Sam. 2:8).

Under the new covenant, God transforms our hearts in sanctification by Holy Spirit. James exhorts Christians to show it by not compromising with worldly wisdom and teachings (1:6-8; 4:8). Prayerfully consider, "What is stealing our full devotion to God? In what ways might I be compromising with the world and it's wisdom?"

for **Children**:

Go for a walk with your family and/or friends and play Fall Bingo (more sheets available on the website). In the fall we see animals leave, and some plants go to sleep or die. But we know that God designed nature to reveal His faithfulness. The animals and plants will return.

Stop to read Hosea 6:1-3. Whenever we notice our spiritual life starting to die back, all we need to do is return to God. He is always faithful and will revive us!
